



Barbadians will always remember what happened on Saturday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021, as they woke up to deeply overcast skies. This was the result of an eruption of the La Soufriere volcano on the neighbouring island of St. Vincent.

The ash was shot into the air by the volcano and blown across the **Caribbean** Sea to our little island. On that day, the ash covered almost every inch of the island. Residents, especially those with asthma and other respiratory disorders, were urged to stay indoors to protect themselves.

Persons were forced to close all windows and doors to reduce any contact with the falling ash. Motorists experienced reduced visibility as they navigated the islands' roads. This experience triggered memories of the volcano's last major eruption exactly 42 years ago.

Although residents in the northern parishes of the island (St. Lucy, St. Peter and St. Andrew) seemed to be affected the most by it, no one could escape the plumes of ash.
