Robert Nesta "Bob" Marley was born on February 6, 1945. He was a Jamaican reggae singer, songwriter, musician, and guitarist who achieved international fame and acclaim.



Bob Marley was a committed Rastafari, an Abrahamic religion which developed in Jamaica in the 1930s. The *Rastafari movement* was a key element in the development of reggae. In 1963, he started his music career with the group *The Wailers*. There, he forged a distinctive songwriting and vocal style that resonated with audiences worldwide. After *The Wailers* disbanded in 1974, Marley pursued a solo career that culminated in the release of the album *Exodus* in 1977. This album established his reputation with sales of more than 75 million records.

In July 1977, Marley was found to have a type of cancer under the nail of a toe. Marley didn't follow his doctors' advice to have his toe amputated because of his religious beliefs. The cancer spread throughout his body. He died on 11 May 1981 at Cedars of Lebanon Hospital in Miami at the age of 36. His final words to his son Ziggy were: "Money can't buy life."
