To show possession add 's to a singular noun, as in Japan's add 's to a plural noun not ending in -s as in woman's add (') to a plural noun ending in -s as in farmers' add (') to some proper nouns with the -s sound as in Texas . In a contraction, an apostrophe stands for the missing letter or letters as in who'll.
