
The Niagara Falls Upside Down House is a tourist attraction that gets a lot of second looks. "The idea actually came from Poland" explains Cyran. "When I was on vacation I saw an upside down house in Poland and then I thought why not build one in Niagara Falls?"

This 1,200 square foot house has six rooms including two bedrooms. There is a bathroom with a sink, toilet and bathtub on the ceiling. There is a kitchen with the table, stove and cabinets all on the ceiling. It is a fully equipped house with electricity and water.
