National Motto	Describes the aims of the Bahamian people
Blue Marlin	National fish
Palm Fronds	Natural vegetation
Sun	A natural resource
Flamingo	National Bird
Sea	Waters of The Bahamas
Conch Shell	Marine life
Royal Helmet	Ruled by royalty
Santa Maria (also the Pinta and Nina are in the background)	Columbus's flagship; the first European to visit The Bahamas

The National Motto

Found on The National Coat of Arms. Its purpose is to inspire Bahamians to work together for a better future.

The National Motto

The first Bahamian motto was:
 "Expulsis, Piratis, Restituta Commercia"
 "Pirates Expelled, Commerce Restored"
 Is out-of-date because there are no more pirates in The Bahamas today.

The National Flag

- Black- represents the strength and determination of the people to develop the rich resources of the land
- Gold-represents the blazing sun
- Aquamarine-represents the sea

To show respect, the national flag should never be flown after sunset.
