

- from the greengrocer's to the department store.
- from the supermarket to the car park.
- from the bank to the optician's.
- from the jeweller's to the florist's.
- from the police station to the school.

• Order of adjectives

Adjectives can express opinion (*nice, strange* etc) or fact (*blue, modern* etc). When two or more adjectives are used before a noun, opinion adjectives come before the ones expressing fact.

When there are more than two adjectives the order usually is:

opinion	<i>good, practical, bad</i> etc
size	<i>huge, big, tiny</i> etc
age	<i>modern, new, ancient</i> etc
shape	<i>round, square, oval</i> etc
colour	<i>dark pink, red, grey</i> etc
pattern	<i>striped, checked, floral</i> etc
origin	<i>Italian, Russian, Greek</i> etc
material	<i>leather, silver, wooden</i> etc

There's a nice, small, new, round, black and white, striped, English cotton cushion on the sofa.
