As with most Indian festivals, there are regional custom variations throughout India. Where my family and I live, we always build a bonfire. Of course, despite its joyful character, the day has a more serious side too. The burning of objects in the bonfire symbolizes getting yourself clean and ready for the New Year. That's why people pay or **forgive** debts, become friends and **forgive** each other and generally try to forget and leave behind any fights or anything negative from the old year. Holi is a festival which ends the year on a happy note and begins the New Year on a fresh, hopeful one. It makes us all feel better for having celebrated it.

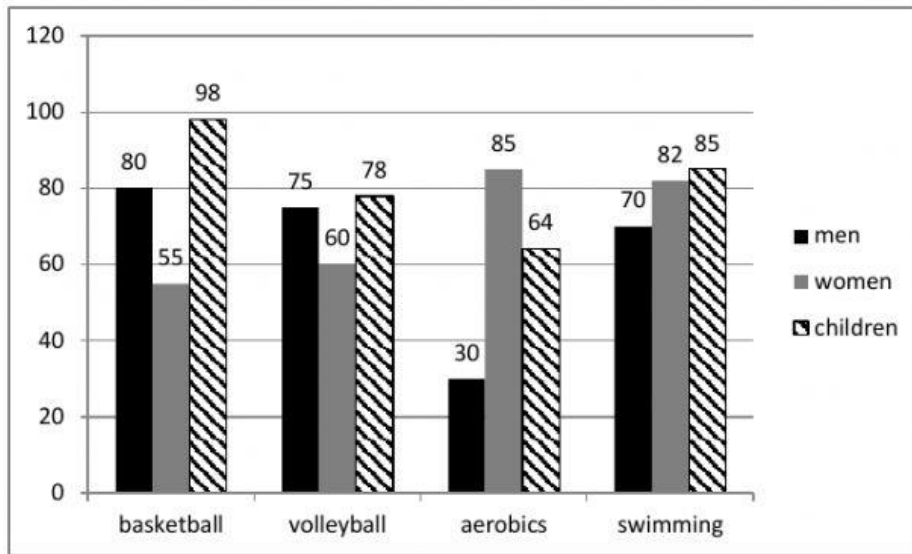
