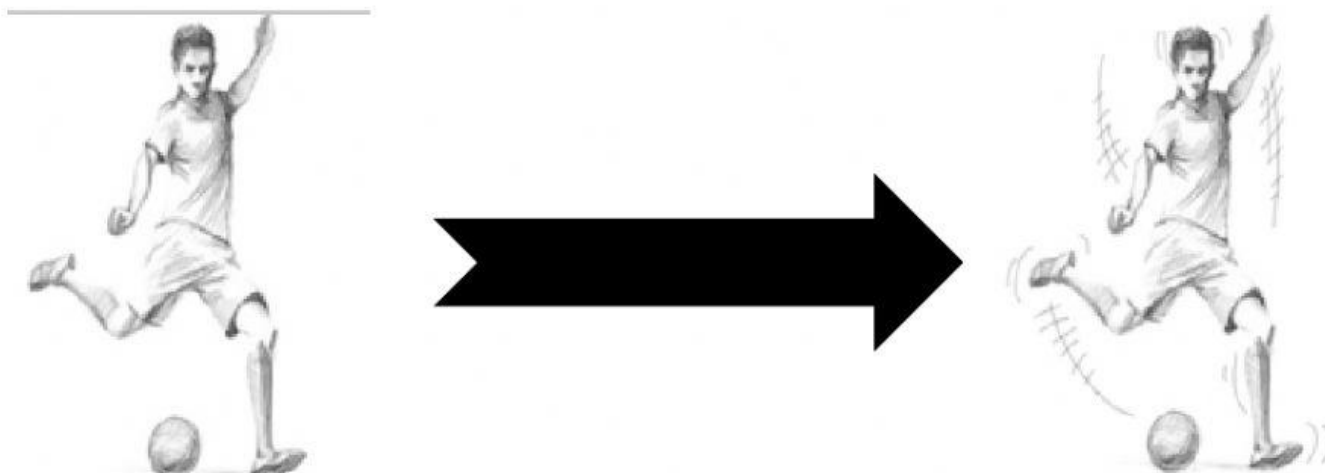

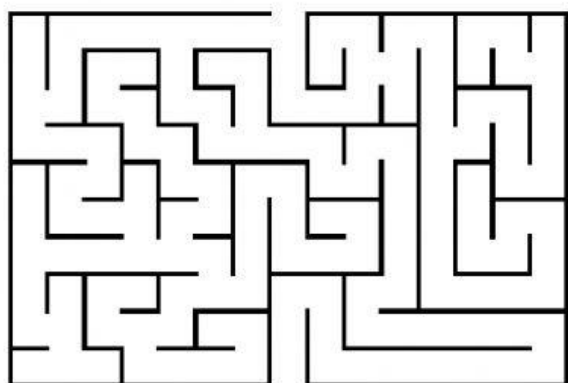
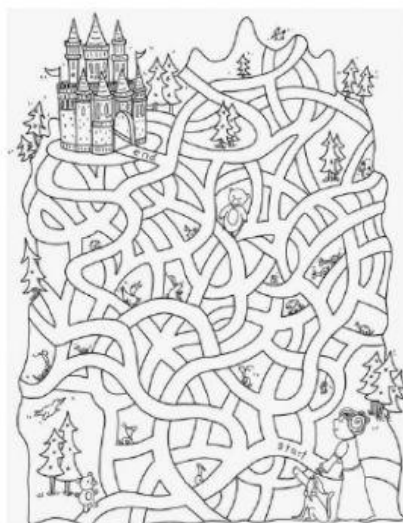
Exercise 2: DRAW lines to show motion, I give you an example with the first drawing:
