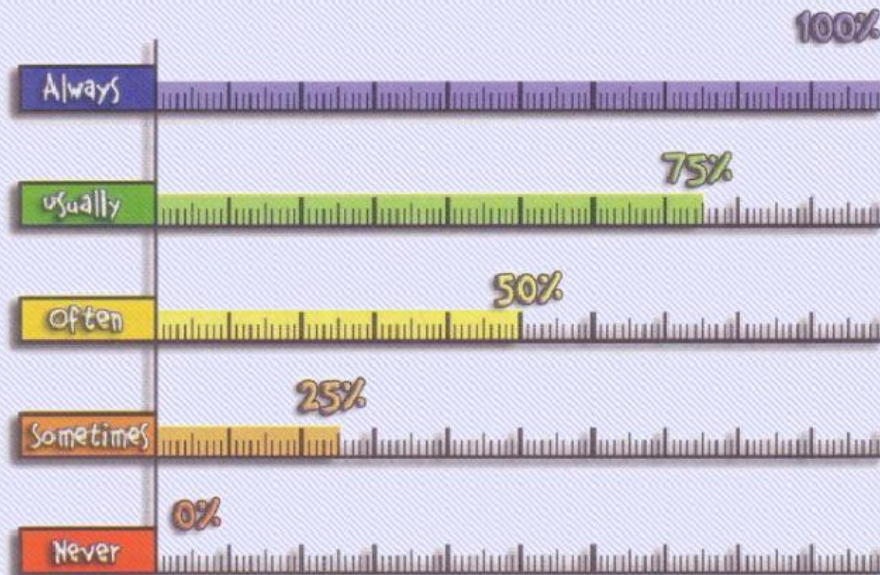


## Always, Usually, Often, Sometimes, Never

- We use frequency adverbs to describe how often something happens. We use them with the Present Simple tense.



- We place the frequency adverbs **BEFORE** the main verb (in Present Simple).

*I always walk to work.*

*He doesn't usually wear jeans.*

*Do you often write letters?*

- BUT**, we put them **AFTER** the verb **TO BE**.

*He is never late.*

*The children aren't usually tired after school.*

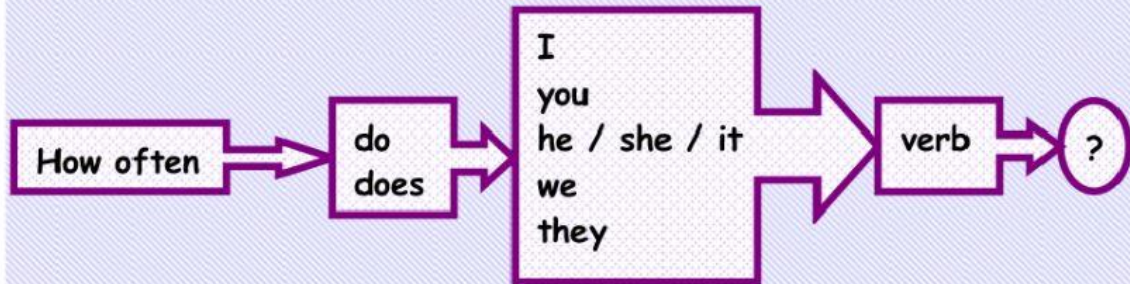
*Are you often sad?*



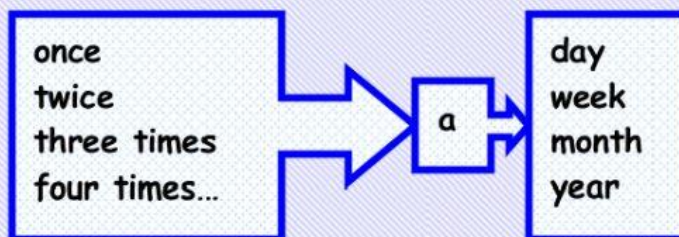


## OTHER EXPRESSIONS OF FREQUENCY

**How often...?** → To ask about the frequency of an action.  
We place it at the beginning of the question.



*How often do you go to the cinema?*  
*How often does Mary cook?*



*We go to the theatre **once a week**.*  
*Peter plays football **five times a month**.*



*Mary cooks **every day**.*  
*I play tennis **every Sunday**.*

The rest of the frequency expressions  
are placed at the end of the sentence
