

READING: Safe Driving

There are a few basic rules that everyone should follow when they drive. First, drivers should make sure that the passengers are using their seat belts. Also, children who weigh less than 40 lbs. must be in child safety seats.



Second, the car should be in good working condition. All drivers should regularly inspect their cars to make sure that everything is working properly. Drivers should check to make sure that all tires have enough air, that the brakes are working properly, that the horn sounds, and that all the lights work.

Third, drivers need to follow the rules of safe driving when they are behind the steering wheel. Drivers should drive at the speed limit and keep a safe distance behind the car in front of them. Drivers should also stop for school buses and slow down in work zones. Additionally, they should move to the right side of the street when they hear or see emergency vehicles.

Drivers need to be aware of safe driving rules, and they also need to be prepared for situations when safe driving may be difficult. A safe driver is a prepared and alert driver.
