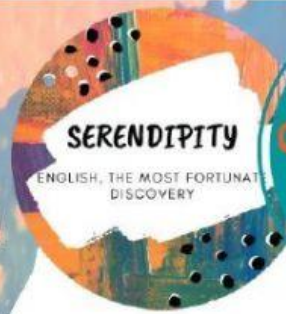

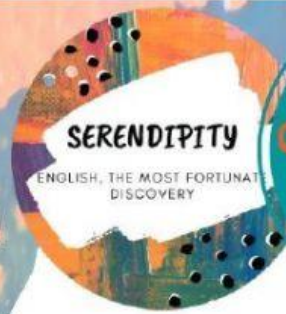
## THE HOLLYWOOD WALK OF FAME
