First Conditional	
Structure	IF + Simple Present, Simple Future (S + will/won't + V(bare form))
Usage	To talk about possibilities in the present or in the future
Examples	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If it rains, I will stay at home. • If I wake up late, I will miss the bus. • And, if it's sunny, we'll go to the park. • If Juan leaves, Paula will be sad. • If I find your email, I will send you the picture. • If you study hard, you will pass your exams.
