The Invention of the Frisbee®

Many people say they invented the Frisbee®.

- In 1948, a man who was from Los Angeles, Walter Frederic Morrison, and his friend Warren Franscioni, invented a plastic "frisbie" that could fly further and better than a pie pan.
- In 1955, Rich Knerr and A.K. "Spud" Melin, the owners of "Wham-O", saw the Pluto Platter and loved it. Morrison sold them the rights and made a lot of money from this invention. Knerr used the words "frisbie" and "frisbie-ing" to create the popular Frisbee®.
- Later, Morrison made another plastic "frisbie", which was called the Pluto Platter. That "frisbie" was the design for all the rest.
- The Frisbie Baking Company of Bridgeport, Connecticut, made pies and sold them to many colleges. The students used the empty pie pans as a toy. They threw and caught the pans and that was a great game for them.
