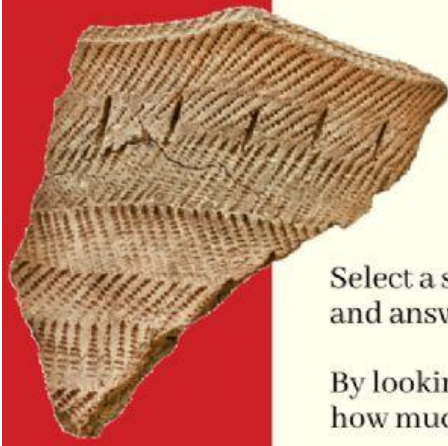




Now that you know a bit more about Archaeology and artifacts and that artifacts are primary sources. It's time to study an artifact for yourself.
