

## PERSONAL PRONOUNS

We use personal pronouns:

- to talk about ourselves

I am happy that you can help **me**.  
**We** are very sad that you can't join **us**.

- to replace a noun we have used before

Tom is my friend. **He** is very clever. I often play football with **him**.

- to address to other people (2<sup>nd</sup> person)

Would **you** like some more coffee?  
I think Bob likes **you**.

- to introduce a remark (it)

**It** was difficult to pass the test.  
**It** is hard to get up early in the morning.

- to talk about the weather, time, distance or temperature (it)

**It** is raining.  
**It** is very cold today.  
**It** is 8 o'clock in the evening.

Singular	Subject	Object	Example
1 <sup>st</sup> person	I	<b>me</b>	I need some help. Can you help <b>me</b> ?
2 <sup>nd</sup> person	<b>you</b>	<b>you</b>	Do <b>you</b> like milk? Carol likes <b>you</b> .
3 <sup>rd</sup> person	<b>he</b>	<b>him</b>	<b>He</b> lives next to me. I often talk to <b>him</b> .
	<b>she</b>	<b>her</b>	<b>She</b> needs some help. Please help <b>her</b> .
	<b>it</b>	<b>it</b>	<b>It</b> was a difficult exam. Could you pass <b>it</b> ?

### Plural

1 <sup>st</sup> person	<b>we</b>	<b>us</b>	<b>We</b> are very glad that you can help <b>us</b> .
2 <sup>nd</sup> person	<b>you</b>	<b>you</b>	Do <b>you</b> need a double room? Can I join <b>you</b> ?
3 <sup>rd</sup> person	<b>they</b>	<b>them</b>	They are thirsty. Give <b>them</b> some water, please.
