The European Union



Who represents Spain in international relations?

The European Union (EU) is a political and economic union of 28 member countries. Its main objective is to promote peace and ensure the well-being of EU citizens. To do this, the EU works to improve the economic and social development of member states.

The values of the EU include: respect for human dignity and human rights, freedom, democracy, equality and the rule of law. The EU motto (a short phrase that represents the beliefs of the EU) is 'United in diversity'.

History of the European Union

Six European countries (France, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Belgium and Luxembourg) united in 1957 to promote economic cooperation. Originally, the EU was called the **European Economic Community (EEC)**. Spain joined the EEC in 1986. In 1993, the EEC became the European Union.




