Valentine's Day isn't all about flowers and chocolates around the world. Different countries celebrate it in their own way.

In the United Kingdom is on February 14 and it's called "Festival Of Romantic Love". In a tradition people sent anonymous valentines to their romantic interests, **also** they started the tradition of giving roses on Valentine's Day. **Meanwhile**, in Mexico, February 14 isn't just for **couples** and it is known as the "Day of Love and Friendship". **Unlike** the United Kingdom, traditional gifts are **balloons**, flowers, **stuffed animals**, and cards to show appreciation for romantic interests and platonic friends. **On the contrary**, residents of Wales celebrate "St. Dwynwen's Day" on January 25. St. Dwynwen is the Welsh patron saint of lovers and men traditionally gift women with **hand-carved wooden spoons**. **Instead of** celebrating St. Valentine, Brazilians honor St. Anthony, the patron saint of marriage **and matchmaking**, on June 12 and is known as "Lovers Day" and the usual gifts are flowers, chocolates and cards.
