## THE GERUND Verb + -ing

• a preposition	about, before, after, instead of, without, at, in, on...
• verbs indicating the beginning or the end of an action	start, carry on/keep on/go on stop/quit
• the expressions	<b>It's no use...</b> <b>It's worth...</b> <b>I'm (not) used to...</b> <b>I'm looking forward to...</b>
• verbs that express an appreciation, a judgment, a feeling	Like, love, enjoy, prefer, hate, loathe, resent sb for..., feel like, deny, avoid, remember... I can't stand... / I can't bear... I don't mind... I'm fond of / I'm keen on
• when the verb is the subject of the sentence	Learn <u>ing</u> English is such a pleasure ☺
