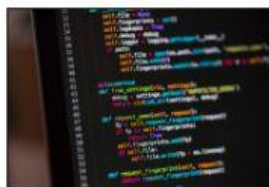

Present Simple

We use the present simple to talk about something that is always true, a habit or routine, and a fixed timetable.

Affirmative

Negative

I / We / You / They	dance.	I / We / You / They	don't dance.
He / She / It	dances.	He / She / It	doesn't dance.

Questions

Do	I / we / you / they	dance?
Does	he / she / it	dance?

Short answers

Yes,	I / we / you / they	do.
	he / she / it	does.
No,	I / we / you / they	don't.
	he / she / it	doesn't.

Time expressions

We use these (adverbs of frequency) with the present simple to say **how often** something happens.

Always	100 %
Usually / Normally	↑
Often / Frequently	
Sometimes	
Never	0%

We use them **before main verbs**:
*We **always** dance together.*

After be:
*We **are normally** tired after dancing.*

At the **beginning/end of a sentence**:
***On Mondays** he has football.
I have singing lessons **every week**.*
