RULES

The word **good** is an adjective. It describes a noun.

Mom has a good job.

The word well is usually an adverb. It tells more about a verb

Mom writes well.

Well is used as an adjective only when it describes a person's health.

Mom is well enough to go to work today.

Use the adjective good to describe a noun. It can come before the non, or it can following a linking verb.
