




Prepositions of movement (up, down, past, through, towards, across)

Go ... the bus stop.





He is swimming ... the pool.





One day I want to sail ... the sea.





Jane gets ... the bus every morning.





Jenny is coming ... the water slide.





This is how you go ... an escalator.




