## Fast Cars and Frozen Lakes

How do car companies test their cars for safety?



Fast sports cars. Cool technology. Spy photographers. You'll find all this and more in the Arjeplog region of Sweden. Every winter, car companies arrive in Arjeplog to test their newest cars.

Arjeplog, with more than 30,000 lakes, is near the Arctic Circle. In winter, temperatures can be as low as -40 degrees Celsius. The freezing temperatures mean the lakes stay frozen all winter. These icy surfaces are perfect for testing cars. Drivers can go very fast, then hit the brakes hard. The car can skid safely because there's nothing to crash into on top of a frozen lake. Car companies know this: cars that drive well over Arjeplog's lakes will drive well anywhere.

The capital of this snowy region is a tiny village, also named Arjeplog. Only 1,800 people live in Arjeplog. But from January to April, so many drivers, engineers, and other workers arrive that the number of people grows to almost 8,000! Most of these winter visitors work for the car companies. However, a few are actually spies! They travel around Arjeplog and try to take photographs of secret prototypes.

Winter visitors help the local economy in many ways. The guests eat in restaurants and stay in hotels. They also go on nature trips and enjoy snow sports. But car testing is the main reason people come. Philip Talboys, a manager at Jaguar-Land Rover, looks forward to his trip to Arjeplog every winter. According to Talboys, "A lot of cars wouldn't be on the market if not for Arjeplog. For such a small, remote place, it's amazingly important to the industry."
