ESC

What do the letters ESC mean to you? Is it the button in the corner of your keyboard, (0) ___ that allows you to “escape”? Or do you immediately think of the Eurovision Song Contest, the yearly pop competition (1) ___ by television viewers all over the world?

Only seven countries (2) ___ in the first ESC in 1956, but since then more and more have joined in. Today the ESC is a major event, and winning has become extremely important for both the singers and their countries.
