



Present Perfect

The present perfect tense refers to an action or state that either **occurred at an indefinite time in the past** (e.g., we have talked before) or began in the past and continued to the present time (e.g., he has grown impatient over the last hour).

This tense is formed by **have/has + the past participle**.

Present perfect tense

We form the present perfect tense with **have / has + past participle**.

I You We They	have	eaten	an apple.
------------------------	------	-------	-----------

He She It John	has	eaten	an apple.
-------------------------	-----	-------	-----------

Sbj + has/have + V3		Sbj + has/have NOT + V3	
He She It + I You We You They	has + have + started	He She It + I You We You They	has not hasn't + have not haven't + started
+	Ex: I have done it. Ex: He has done it.	-	Ex: I have not (haven't) done it. Ex: He has not (hasn't) done it.
