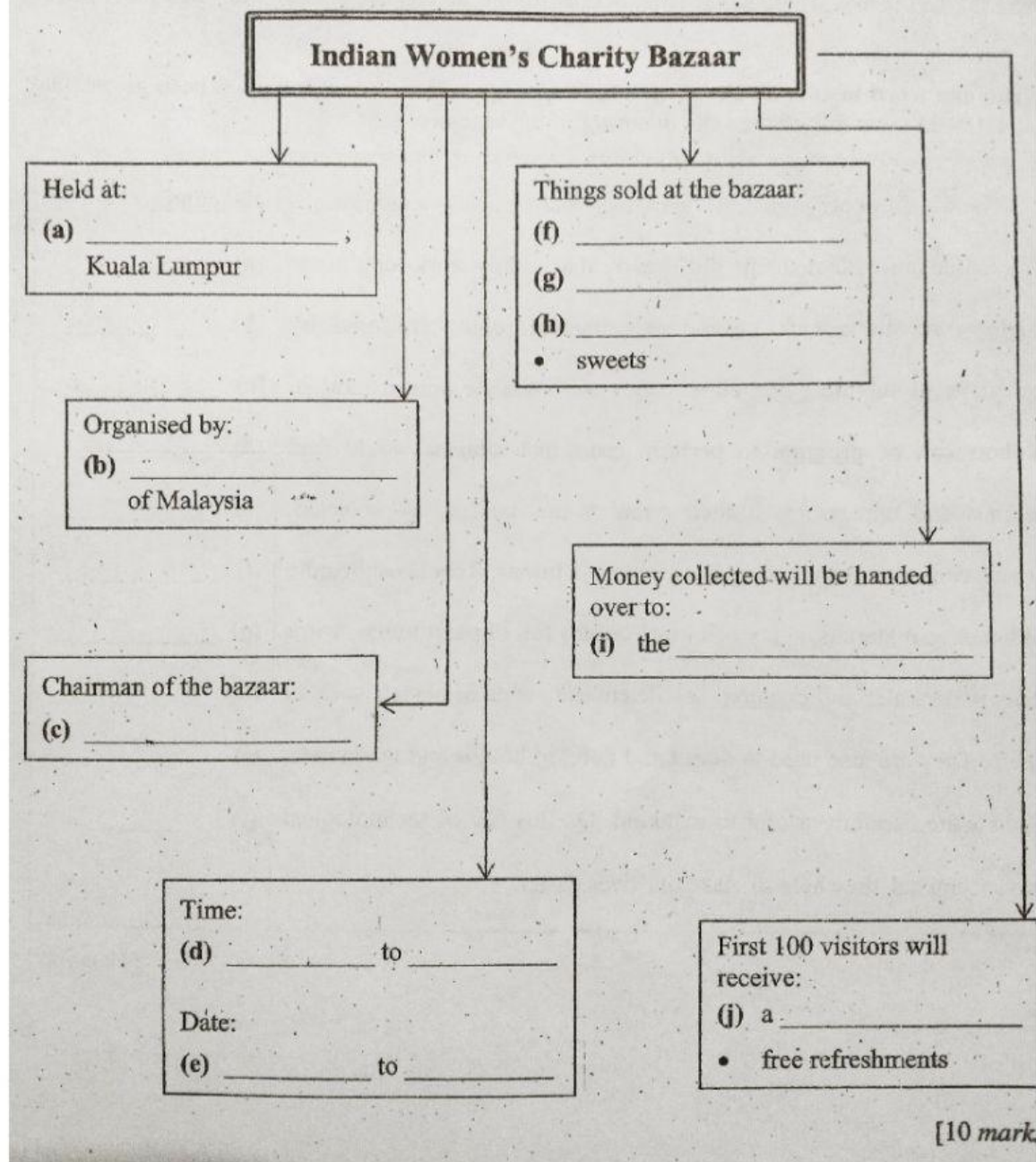
The bazaar will be open from 10.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. every day from 12 to 22 October.
