

# HAVE TO / DON'T HAVE TO

Pronouns	Affirmative sentences	Negative sentences	Questions
I, we, you, they	I <b>have to get up</b> early.	I <b>do not have to get up</b> early.	<b>Do I have to get up</b> early?
he, she, it	She <b>has to get up</b> early.	She <b>does not have to get up</b> early.	<b>Does she have to get up</b> early?

**REMEMBER:** **do + not** = **don't**   **does + not** = **doesn't**

Choose “**have to**” / “**has to**” in the affirmative (AFF) sentences

or “**don’t have to**” / “**doesn’t have to**” in the negative (NEG) sentences.
