Exercise 1: Match each poetic device with the *clue(s) to help you define what it is.

3		alluding to / making a reference to something or someone famous

5		images relating to the senses: sight (seeing), taste, smell, hearing and touch (feeling)			
6		repeating a word or a group of words
