

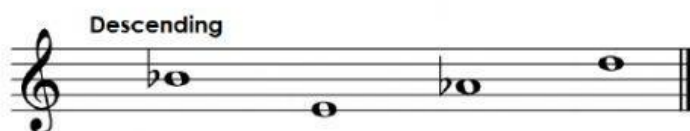

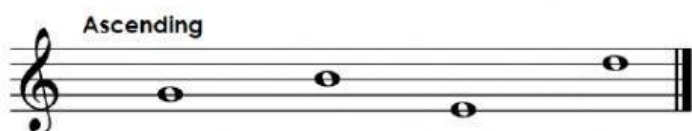

Exercise 2: Choose the correct option to form major 2nd intervals with the following notes.



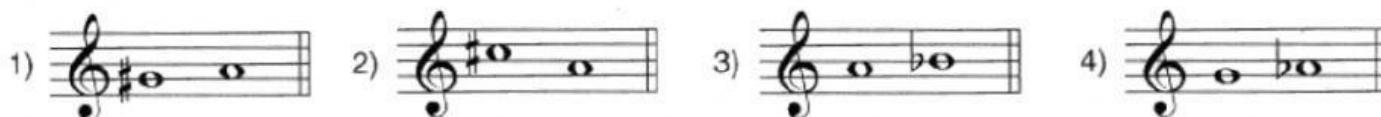

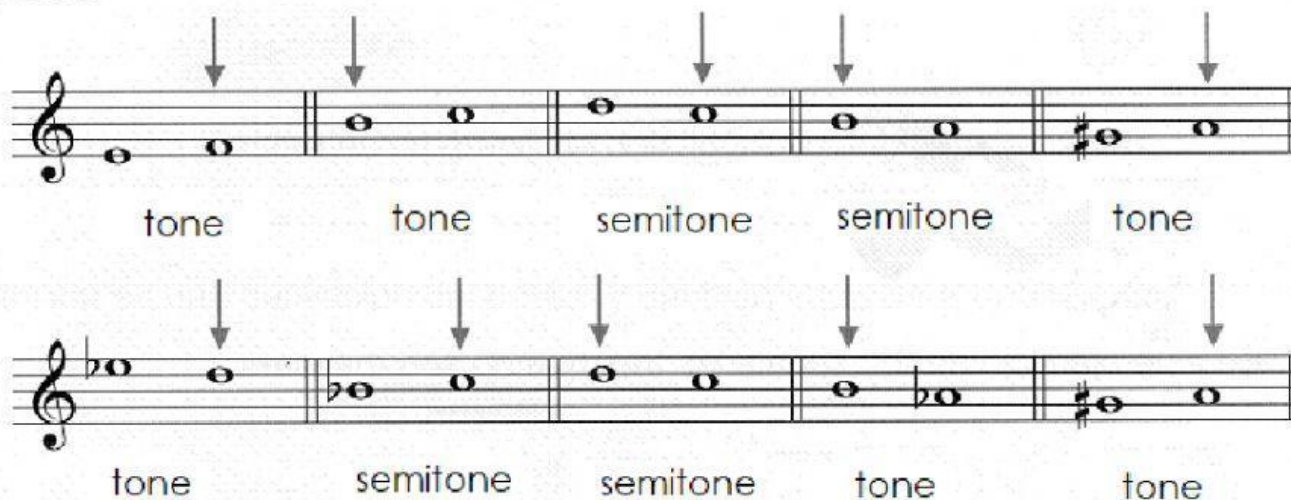


Exercise 4: Write the accidental (**#** or **b**) to the natural notes when necessary to form intervals of major 2nd and 3rd. Respect the altered notes.

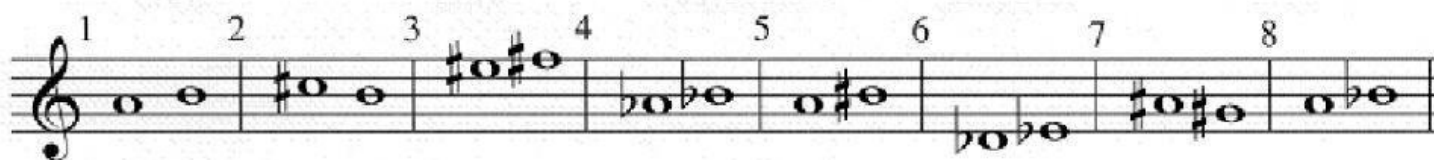




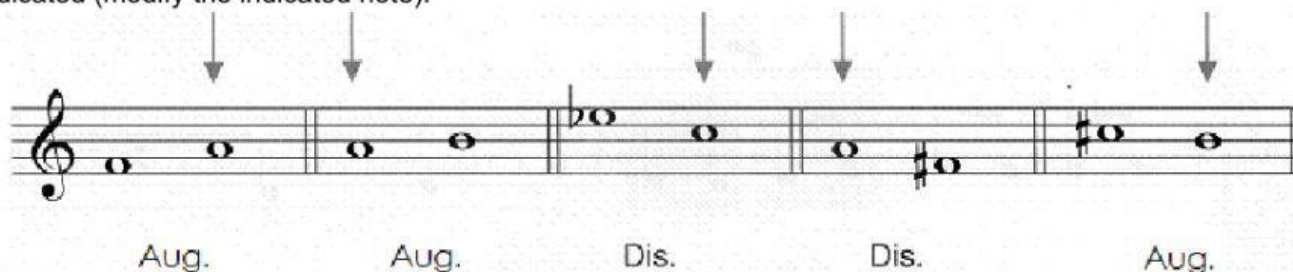
Exercise 5: Write the corresponding alteration (**#** or **b**) next to the indicated notes to get the interval distance that is asked.

Exercise 7: By means of alterations, you must convert the following intervals into augmented or diminished as indicated (modify the indicated note).



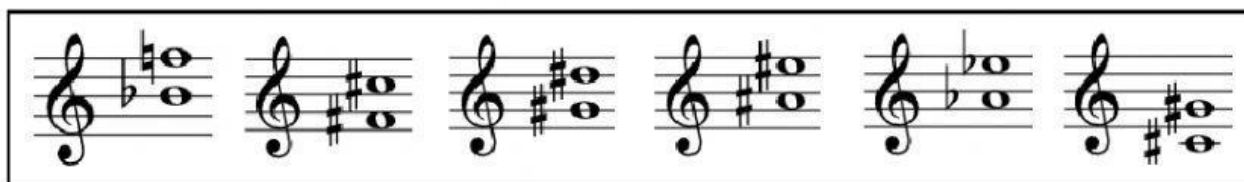
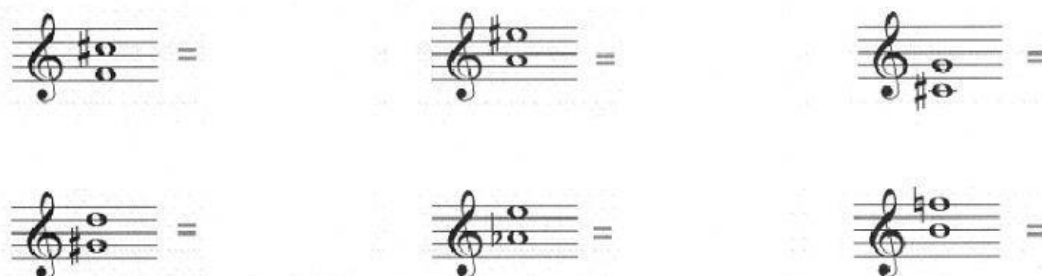
Exercise 8: What sound would you choose to form **perfect 4th** intervals from these notes?
