

PRESENT SIMPLE

- affirmative form

I swim
you swim
he/she/it swims
we/you/they swim

We add **-es**, when a verb ends with: **-o, -ch, -sh, -x, -tch, -ch**
watch - watches; wash - washes
and **-ies** when a verb ends with **'y** but is preceded by a consonant! > try - he tries
