

There is information here that helps you break the monotony of your everyday recipes. So, enjoy and have fun! Are you ready? Take a look at what you have got in your fridge. Are there any bananas? Are there any carrots? Well, let's bake some banana carrot cookies for two. Make sure there is oatmeal too. If there isn't any, go get it at the local store. I assure you this is a simple but perfect recipe to start cooking. First, peel and chop a couple of carrots; about 3/4 (75%) cup. Then, with a fork, mash 2 bananas in a bowl. End of the Mayan civilization

After 800 CE, many of the Mayan states began to collapse, possibly because of over-clearing of the forests, which led to desertification (process in which fertile land becomes desert) and massive crop failure. However, some Maya communities in Mexico continued to thrive until Spanish invaders arrived in the 16th century and took over the region. Many cities, such as Tikal (shown here), were swallowed up by the rainforest and were not rediscovered until modern times. There are still some Mayan communities that live much like ancient Maya, speaking the same language and growing food in the same way.
