Jalal Bin Thaneya is director and star of this film. He documents his journey with touching honesty as he walks 2000 km from the United Arab Emirates to Mecca. While he walks, he thinks about life and humanity, and he also overcomes several challenges on his way to the holy city.

Don't miss! Arab Cinema Classics

We will be screening our film experts' top picks, including:

C Al Mummia (The Mummy)
This film is thought to be one of the greatest Egyptian films. It's a tale of tomb robbers in 19th century Egypt, but it's also about a country trying to find its cultural identity. The director, Chadi Abdel Salam, filmed at dawn and dusk so the dramatic lighting, combined with a haunting sound track, gives the film a great atmosphere.

D Al-Makhdu'un (The Duples)
This film is directed by the Egyptian Tewfik Saleh and is based on the short novel by Palestinian writer Ghassan Kanafani. It is set in Iraq, although it was actually filmed in Syria. The story follows three poor Palestinian men who set off on a journey across the desert to try to get to Kuwait, where they hope to make new and better lives for themselves.
