EXPRESSING THINGS IN COMMON

Adverbial expressions used as a response to show that you agree with the other person or people.

Affirmative Expressions
SUBJECT + AUX + TOO

Negative Expressions
SUBJECT + AUX + NOT + EITHER.

Verb to be : AM, ARE, IS

Other verbs: DO, DOES, CAN

When you don't agree use the opposite expression.

Affirm. Oh, Subj + auxn't

Neg. Oh, Subj + aux
