Zebras' Stripes Stop Flies, Says Scientific Study

Why do zebras have stripes?

Scientists believe that a zebra's stripes confuse flies. To test this, they put striped coats on horses. They noticed that fewer flies landed on those wearing the coats.

Scientists believe they have found out why zebras have stripes. To find out why they put striped coats on horses.

In the wild, zebra short-haired coats make it more likely for flies to feed on their blood vessels. This can be fatal for them.

However, scientists believe a zebra's stripes prevent parasites from feeding on them. Parasites can be extremely bad for horses. If a parasite feeds on a horse, it can get an infection. This can lead to a horse developing a disease.

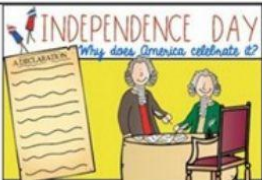
