Types of Government

A perfect government does not exist. Nevertheless, some forms of government are better than others. There are four main types of government: **Democracy, Monarchy, Republic and Dictatorship.**

Democracy Government

In a democracy, the government is elected by the people. It is sometimes referred to as a **“Government for the people and by the people”**. Everyone who is eligible to vote has a chance to have their say over who runs the country. A democracy is determined either directly or through elected representatives. Some of the freedoms include: free elections, freedom of speech, freedom of religion, freedom of movement, freedom to assemble, several political parties, one cannot be jailed without a trial and power is shared amongst numerous bodies e.g. cabinet leaders- in charge of various ministries / judges – administering the law. Examples of democratic governments include: The Bahamas, the United Kingdom (Britain), France and United States of America.

Monarchy Government

A monarchy has a sovereign King, Queen, Emperor or Empress. The ruling position can be passed on to the ruler's heirs. In some traditional monarchies, the monarch has absolute power. But a constitutional monarchy, like The Bahamas, also has a democratic government that limits the monarch's control. Examples include: The Bahamas, the United Kingdom (Britain), Canada, Denmark, Belgium, Saudi Arabia, Jamaica, Thailand.

Republic Government

A republic is a country that has no monarch. The head of the country is usually an elected president. The position of president is not hereditary. Examples include: The United States of America, France, Haiti and South Africa

Dictatorship Government

A country ruled by a single leader or a small group of people. The leader is called a dictator. The leader has not been elected and may use force to keep control. In a military dictatorship, the army is in control. There are very few freedoms. There is no freedom of speech, no freedom of movement, no elections, one can be jailed without a trial or even killed if one speaks out against the government. Examples include: China, Afghanistan, North Korea, Russia and Iraq.
