Walk around the streets of Stirling in Scotland or Caracas in Venezuela and what type of music will you hear? Hip hop, Latin, folk? Yes, but you will also hear classical. A few years 1) ago only one school child in the Raploch area of Stirling was learning a musical instrument. Now, hundreds of children are 2) learning instruments, and in 2012 some of them performed live with Venezuela's famous Simón Bolívar Orchestra. 8,000 people were in the audience. The musician José Antonio Abreu wanted to offer free music lessons to children who lived in places where there weren't many after-school activities. His idea was simple. Give children classical music and they learn to work as a team, and they gain confidence. He knew that it would also help the community, so he began 'El Sistema', which means 'the system'. In the beginning, there 5) were just eleven children. Since then, more than two million have taken part in the system.

15 One of those students is Genesis da Silva who dreams of being a great musician. 6) Every day after school, she spends five hours playing the clarinet before going home and practising more. She lives with her family and they all want her to do well. She says that the 7) most important thing is to enjoy the music she says. Genesis is sure she can win a place in the system's Simón Bolívar Orchestra. After all her hard work, if she didn't get a place her family and friends would be very surprised.

Leswi Pantoja is a professional musician in the Simón Bolívar Orchestra and has known his musical friends 8) since he was eleven years old. What would his life be like if he didn't have his music? It's hard to imagine. If he didn't play in the orchestra, he wouldn't have so many friends. 'We've grown 9) up together as a family,' he says. Although Leswi grew up with Latin music and salsa, when he joined the system he learnt about classical music. Now he enjoys playing both.

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After the success of the system in Venezuela, music teachers in Scotland were keen to see something similar, and in 2008 System Scotland began its own orchestra called The Big Noise. Schoolgirl Morgan is in the orchestra. She had learned to read music and plays many different kinds of instruments now. She loves the Big Noise and wants to keep on playing it in the future. They love being on stage, and the performance by Scottish schoolchildren and Venezuelan musicians showed that those dreams can come true.
