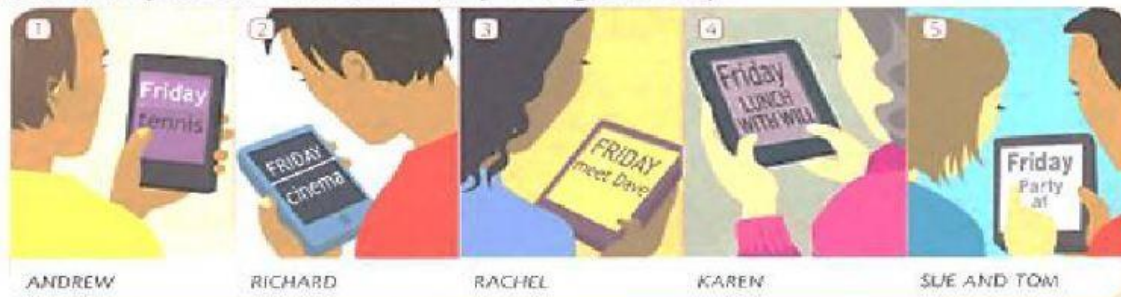


Look at the pictures. What are these people doing next Friday?
