TAKE OFF	land
GET IN	collect sb
GET/GO AWAY	to say goodbye
SET OFF	start a journey
GET ON	to board
TOUCH DOWN	when a plane leaves and begins to fly
GET BACK	return
SEE OFF	go faster, rush
PICK UP	arrive (train ,plane)
DROP OFF	stopping place
STOP BY	be excited about
GIVE A RIDE/ A LIFT	explore the area.
LOOK AROUND	take in car
STOP OVER	to take someone to a place and leave them there
HOLD UP	delay when travelling
HURRY UP	go on holiday, escape
LOOK FORWARD TO	a short visit
