



Word Work says...

When you're writing, there are

two very important words you use: **and** and **but**.

Use **and** to connect two similar ideas. Look:

I like musicals. I like horror films.

I like musicals **and** horror films.

Use **but** to contrast two ideas. Look:

I can ride a bike. I can't ride a horse.

I can ride a bike, **but** I can't ride a horse.

Use a comma before **but**.

*Now, you practice!*

*I like English. I like Maths.*

*I like English \_\_\_\_\_ Maths.*

*I like reading. I don't like riding a horse.*

*I like reading, \_\_\_\_\_ I don't like riding a horse.*
