Condition	Result
<b>If-clause</b>	<b>Main clause</b>
1) If + <b>Present Simple</b> ,	... <b>Present simple</b>
<i>If I <b>have</b> time,</i>	<i>I <b>read</b> books.</i>
2) If + <b>Present Simple</b> ,	<b>Command ...</b>
<i>If you <b>need</b> me,</i>	<i><b>call</b> me.</i>
<b>Comma!</b>	

Result	Condition
<b>Main clause</b>	<b>If-clause</b>
1) <b>Present Simple ...</b>	if + <b>Present Simple</b>
<i>I <b>read</b> books</i>	<i>if I <b>have</b> time.</i>
2) <b>Command ...</b>	if + <b>Present Simple</b>
<i><b>Call</b> me</i>	<i>if you <b>need</b> me.</i>
<b>No comma!</b>
