Grammar summary

Can (request)

Can I have a burger, please?

Can I have a coffee, please?

Can we have two portions of chips, please?

Can we have two hot dogs, please?

Note

- To make a request, we use *Can* + subject + infinitive of the verb without *to*.

Can we have a drink, please?

Common mistake

Can we to have a burger? X

Can we have a burger. ✓

I can have a packet of crisps? X

Can I have a packet of crisps? ✓
