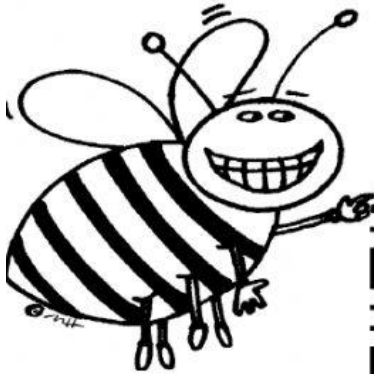




Objective: Express future plans by using "be going to"

BE GOING TO + INFINITIVE



AFF.: We are going to travel to Spain tomorrow.

NEG.: We aren't going to travel to Spain tomorrow.

INT.: Are we going to travel to Spain tomorrow?

We use 'Be going to + infinitive' to talk about:

- Conclusions,
- Plans and future arrangements.
