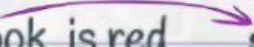

Possessive adjectives vs Possessive pronouns



Remember!

We use **POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES** before a noun.  (antes de un sustantivo)

HER book is red  sustantivo → book

We use **POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS** in place of a noun.  (en lugar de un sustantivo)

→ Is that **YOUR** dress? It's very similar to **MINE**
It's very similar to **MY** dress.

 **MINE** está reemplazando a "my dress". Lo usamos para evitar repetir el sustantivo "dress"
