

Noun clauses as subjects

1. Change the clause for a normal subject

Example:

X) *That she worked hard for the whole term pleased her parents.*

Her hard work pleased her parents.

A) *Whatever you want is fine with me.*

B) *What moved him was a sense of those worlds around us.*

C) *What we remember forms the most personal map of our individuality.*

D) *How the clouds formed on that July afternoon still makes me smile.*

E) *Where the candy bar is hidden remains a mystery.*

2. Change the normal subject for a clause

Example:

X) *His performance today impressed the judges.*

How he performed today impressed the judges.

F) *Your taste worry me sometimes.*

G) *Her reasons to leave were unknown.*

H) *Your wishes are weird.*

I) *The form of her smile was peculiar.*

J) *Kristoff's secret location continues under investigation*

Form	Example
Noun clause 1: What/Who + verb + noun/adjective	
Noun clause 2: What/How/Who/Where + noun + base form + C.
