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TO SET OUT

Michael is gone for a trek. He set out about an hour ago.

TO CHECK IN

When I arrived in Barcelona I made my way to my hotel and checked in at about 2.30 pm.

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TO HOP ON

We hopped on the train and went back to the hostel.

TO GET AROUND

His friend wanted to know how he intended getting around.



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TO SEE SMB OFF

Her parents went to the airport to see her off.

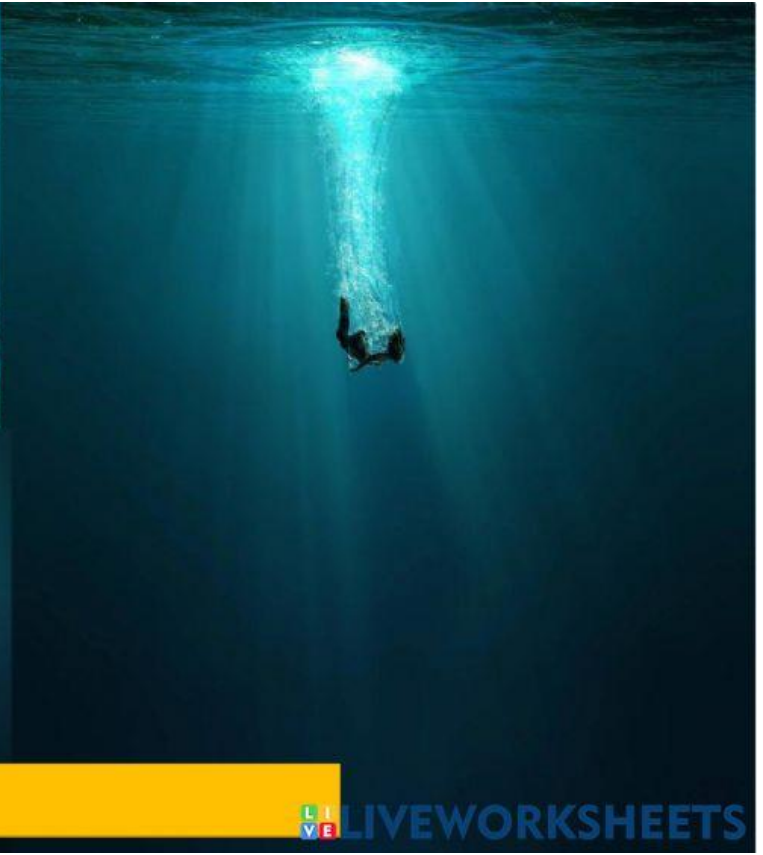

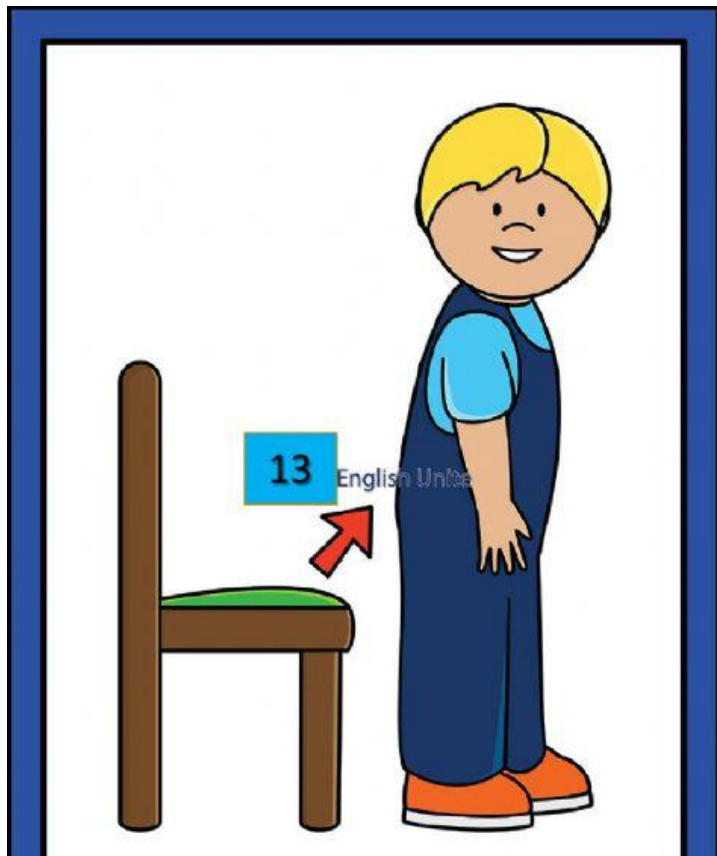

Verb: **STAND**

Stand means: have or maintain an upright position, supported by one's feet

V1	V2	V3
Stand	Stood	Stood

Synonym Words For **STAND**

Examples

- Who **stood**?
- I can hardly **stand**.
- Samuel **stood** up again.
- Don't **stand** in my way.
- Alex **stood** up suddenly.

PHRASAL VERBS WITH STAND

Stand out

Be obvious or conspicuous, in contrast to one's surroundings

E.g. Tourist guides often carry umbrellas so that they **stand out** in a crowd.

Stand up

Bring something up and set it into a standing position

E.g. Laura **stood** the sofa **up** on end.

Stand aside

Step sideways to make a space for someone else

E.g. **Stand aside**, please, so the doctor can get through.

Stand back

Maintain a safe distance from a hazard

E.g. You had better **stand back** and let me operate the machine.

(stand in for)
