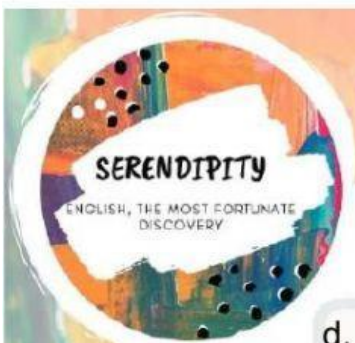

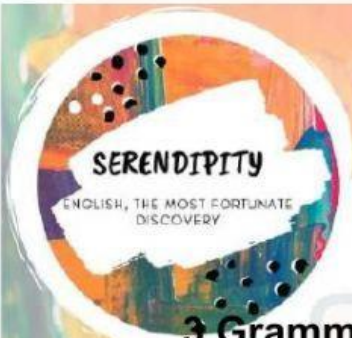

We can use *be going to* + verb (infinitive) to make predictions
(= to say what you think or can see is going to happen in the future).

I think it's **going to** rain.

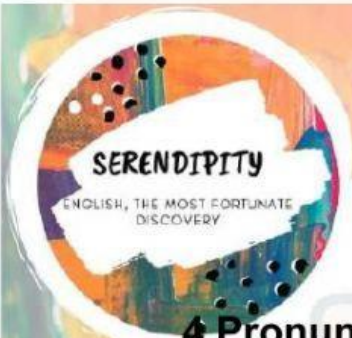
You're **going to be** very happy.

I'm sure they're **going to win**.

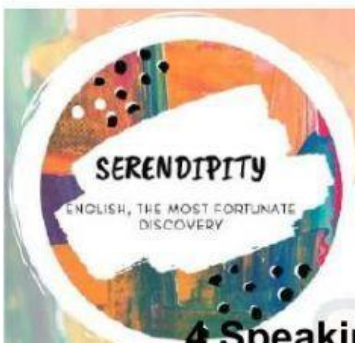
The pronunciation of oo

oo can be pronounced /ʊ/ (e.g. *book* /bʊk/) or /u:/ (e.g. *spoon* /spu:n/). Use your dictionary to check the pronunciation of new oo words.

Be careful, *room* can be pronounced /rʊm/ or /ru:m/.
