



NOUN is a POS (part of speech) that names a person, place, animal, thing or an idea.

Countable Nouns are those which can be counted.

- *These nouns are treated as separate items.*
- *Countable nouns can be singular or plural.*
- *They can be used with a/an and with numbers and many other determiners (e.g. these, a few):*
e.g. a car, three cars
my cousin, my two cousins
a book, a box full of books
a city, several big cities
these dresses
a few packs of chips

Uncountable Nouns are those cannot be separated or counted.

- *These nouns are seen as a whole or mass.*
- *These nouns are not used with a/an or numbers and are not used in the plural.*

e.g. **Ideas and experiences:** *advice, information, progress, news, luck, fun, work*
Materials and substances: *water, rice, cement, gold, milk*

Weather words: *weather, thunder, lightning, rain, snow*
Names for groups or collections of things: *furniture, equipment, rubbish, luggage*
Other common uncountable nouns include: *homework, knowledge, money, traffic.*

The determiners “much, some, any” are used with uncountable nouns while “many” is used with the countables.

Use “is” for uncountable nouns and “are” for the countable ones.

Countable phrases for uncountable nouns

UNCOUNTABLE	COUNTABLE
<i>accommodation</i>	<i>a house, a flat, a place to live, a place to stay</i>
<i>money</i>	<i>a note, a coin, a sum of money, a euro, a dollar</i>
<i>work</i>	<i>a job, a task</i>
<i>time</i>	<i>a second, a minute, an hour, a decade, a century</i>
<i>weight</i>	<i>a gram, a kilogram, a ton</i>

REMEMBER: These nouns are not used with *a/an* or numbers and are not used in the plural.

*e.g. We're going to get new **furniture** for the living room.*

Not: ~~We're going to get a new furniture for the living room.~~

OR ~~We're going to get new furnitures for the living room.~~

*We had terrible **weather** last week.*

Not: ~~We had a terrible weather last week.~~

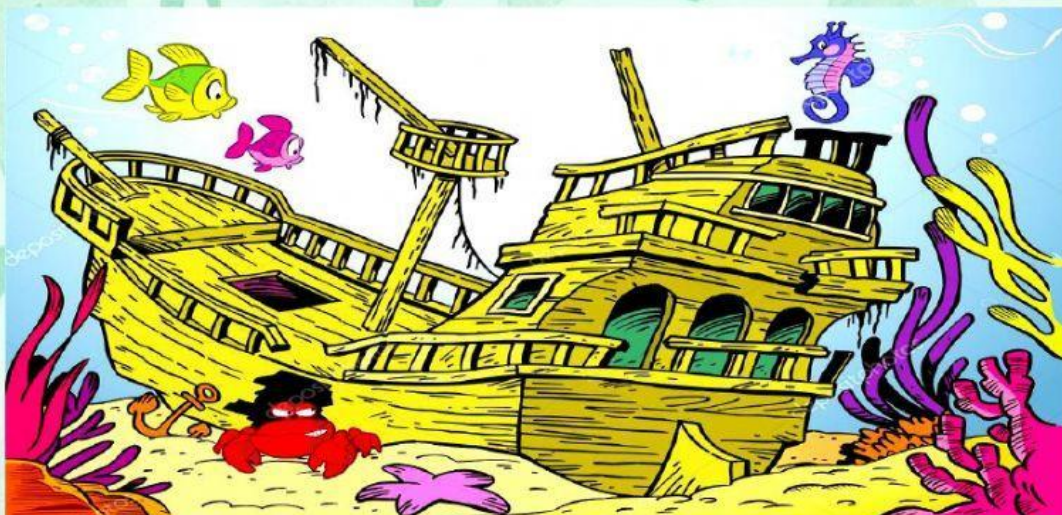

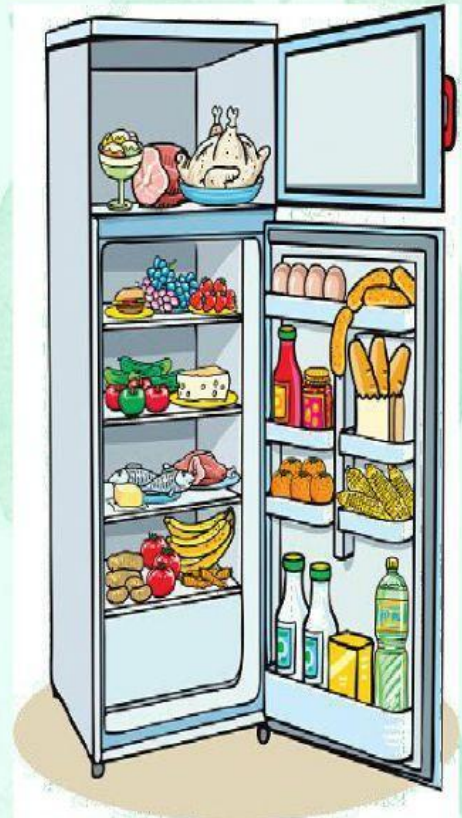
