

# SUPERLATIVES ADJECTIVES



Adjectives with one syllable, add: 'the' + '-est' (or '-st')	<b>cold</b> "January is often <b>the coldest</b> winter month."	Adjectives with two or more syllables, add: 'the' + 'most'	<b>ex-pen-sive</b> "This book is <b>the most expensive</b> book in the store."
Adjectives with two syllables that end in '-y', change '-y' to 'i' and add: 'the' + '-est' (or '-st')	<b>hap-py</b> "John is <b>the happiest</b> person I know."	Adjectives that end in a single vowel and consonant: double the final letter before adding 'the' + '-est' (or '-st')	<b>big</b> "Brazil is <b>the biggest</b> country in South America."

**good** – the best

**bad** – the worst

**far** – the farthest  
the furthest
