 - AVOIDING BLIND SPOTS OF OTHER VEHICLES AND NOT _____ BETWEEN VEHICLES WHEN LANE SPLITTING.
 - USING HIGH BEAM HEADLIGHTS _____ DAYLIGHT HOURS.

- D. WHENEVER POSSIBLE, MOVE TO ONE _____ OF YOUR
LANE TO GIVE MOTORCYCLISTS AMPLE ROOM TO PASS.
- E. WHEN YOU MAKE A TURN, _____ FOR MOTORCYCLISTS
AND GAUGE THEIR SPEED BEFORE TURNING.
- F. LOOK _____ FOR MOTORCYCLISTS BEFORE OPENING
DOORS NEXT TO MOVING TRAFFIC OR BEFORE TURNING RIGHT.
- G. DIFFERENT ROAD CONDITIONS, LIKE POTHOLSE, GRAVEL, WET OR
SLIPPERY _____, PAVEMENT SEAMS, RAILROAD
CROSSINGS, AND GROOVED PAVEMENT, CAN CAUSE
MOTORCYCLISTS TO CHANGE SPEED OR DIRECTION SUDDENLY.
