Ritchie Valens

Richard Steve Valenzuela, the first major Hispanic – American rock star, was born on the 13th May, 1941 in Los Angeles. He _____ (grow up) in the city of Pacoima, California, in a poor family. His one passion _____ (be) music, and particularly liked “cowboy” songs, which _____ (be) very popular in America at that time. Some members of his family introduced him to traditional Mexican music and then, at school, he _____ (discover) rock 'n roll.

While he _____ (attend) classes at junior high school, he started playing music. In 1956 he joined his first band, but it was as a solo artist that he made his first single (*Come on let's go*) at the age of sixteen. Bob Keane, his producer, thought: “If I _____ (change) Ritchie's name from ‘Valenzuela’ to ‘Valens’, he _____ (become) more popular”. And a legend was born.

Although Ritchie's best-known single is *La Bamba*, it only reached number 22 in the charts in 1958. Then he wrote a song about a school friend which _____ (call) *Donna*. This was his biggest hit, which reached number 2 in the charts the same year.

Sadly, Ritchie died in 1959, in a plane crash, with Buddy Holly, who was another famous singer of the time.

Since his death, his popularity _____ (grow) and, in 1987, a film of his life _____ (make) by important producers. The name of the film was, of course, *La Bamba!*
