An epic journey

Captain James Cook was an English explorer, navigator and map-maker. He is famous because he was the captain of the first European ship to visit the east coast of Australia. Cook was born in 1728 in Yorkshire, in the northeast of England. At the age of 18, he decided that he wanted to be a sailor and he began working on local ships. Later, he studied navigation, map-making and astronomy and joined the Navy in 1755. In 1763 and 1764, Cook sailed to North America and made the first maps of the coastline of Newfoundland, which is now part of Canada. Cook's most famous voyage was made between 1768 and 1771, when he sailed around the world. His ship, *The Endeavour*, left England on August 26, 1768, and sailed southwest across the Atlantic and around Cape Horn in South America. Then they sailed across the Pacific Ocean to Tahiti and reached New Zealand on October 6, 1769. Cook and his crew were only the second group of Europeans to visit the country. Cook made maps of the coastline of New Zealand and then sailed west and reached the southeast coast of Australia on April 19, 1770. They were the first Europeans ever to reach Australia's eastern coastline. They landed at a place now called Botany Bay. Cook's sailors gave the place this name because there were so many amazing plants and flowers there. They finally returned to England on July 12, 1771, almost three years after they set off on their epic journey.
